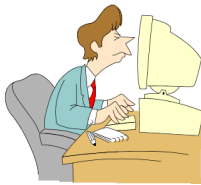

Presented by: Virginia Kysh



Virginia Kysh will be comparing and contrasting the on-line genealogy services: Mocavo, My Heritage, Find My Past and Ancestry.

Virginia is a longtime genealogist, currently the Assistant Director of the Antioch FHC, a volunteer for Find A Grave, and a Board member of the Sacramento German Genealogy Society. She was the Key-note speaker at Digging For Your Roots last October plus teaching three classes. Virginia has been teaching two and three classes for the last several years at this event, always with new topics. She is a genealogist who keeps up with the current happenings in the world of genealogy. Her enthusiasm for genealogy carries over to each of her presentations.

Susan Rush who conducts the SIG class **Family Tree Maker** started us off by displaying the software on a screen as it would appear on our own computer screen so we could follow right along.

She said that the cost for the **Family Tree Maker** 2014 Version software program is \$39.99 but it is now on sale for \$27.99 for previous owners. You can get it by going to **Ancestry.com** and ordering either the disc version or by downloading it. If a person needs immediate help while using

the software they can go on line, speak to a live person by calling the 800 number or using the companion guide that comes with the FTM software for the PC or Mac.

Susan demonstrated the programs sections, working through the “Plan”, “Places”, “Media”, “Sources”, “Publish” and the “Web Search” areas, spending time in each area showing different ways to use each of the spaces.

The new Family Tree Maker offers a new family view. It makes navigation easier. It lets ►

you easily synchronize your tree in Family Tree Maker with the Ancestry.com tree. It has more organizational tools, new and improved charts and reports, more editing options, it saves time with the ability to copy and paste facts including related source citations, media items and notes. There are free learning tools and tutorials to work with. And of course we have our SIG classes.

Sharon Clay and Diane George are **Legacy Family Trees SIG teachers** and shared the presenting chores. Sharon's opinion about what this software can do is "*Everything!*" She really is a fan. You can find the software site at **Legacy FamlyTree.com**.

Legacy describes itself as a family history program and its Legacy 8.0 Standard edition is downloadable for free at www.LegacyFamilyTree.com. It works in tandem with familyhistory.com. It works on Windows only.

It has the ability to store all kinds of information. It has sound, stores pictures, trees, reports, research logs, and more. You can print on it and publish. You can publish on CD's.

One of its best advantages are it's Webinars which are free to the first 1000 who sign up and if you happen to miss it you can go back to the web site for up to a week and still catch it. There is also a possibility you could buy it. ►

Why would you want to upgrade to the Deluxe Version of Legacy Family Tree for \$27.00? Sharon says it's because 98 more options have been added to this version! One of the main things is the "Source Writer" which Diane George went into some detail showing us about.

"Source Writer" is based on the book "*Cite Your Source*" by Elizabeth S. Mills.

Diane proceeded to do a lot of visual things for the audience that would be lost on the reading audience, she said much was in some ways similar to features in Family Tree Maker especially with the multi web searching, etc. and there were things like the cutting and pasting that she just loved and they save so much time so we shall now proceed to our final review of **Reunion**.

Bill George told us about **Reunion** which is a genealogy application for the Macintosh. He set up a simple tree, added a source, showed how to sort a source, correct a site name and showed that Reunion was a lot like FTM and Legacy. He liked what you could do with charts, the special editing and other effects and the catch and drag of pictures attracted his creative side.

Reunion cost \$99.00

In the end we all must decide what will work for us. Do we need only the barest level of organization? Do we want to plan creatively? Write a book with lots of charts and questionnaires and blank family sheets? ■

My Mini-Ed in February centered on organizing. Do not wait to find “just a few more ancestors”. We need to write down just as much ancestry as we have and SOURCE what we have found. With sources, we have genealogical research. Without, we have suggestions and possibilities. Even if our children and grandchildren have little interest now, there will be a time in the future when some of them will look back on all the work we have done and thank us. I look back on two Butler ancestors and thank them for writing down, in the family Bible, valid family births, marriages, and deaths for Butlers and Dorrs to the early 1800s. That information even lead me to a great-great-grandmother's tombstone in an abandoned graveyard near Kahoka, Missouri; a truly spiritual experience. If you are not a computer person, write out a generation chart (preferably 2 or 3 copies, giving some to relatives so there will always be a copy safe elsewhere). Do the same by computer where able, using Reunion (Macs), Legacy, Family Treemaker, Roots Magic, etc. and PDF copies to relatives. Perhaps send one to Salt Lake City for general availability, via Family Search. Think ahead--if I go to the next existence sooner than I expect, will all the glorious information I have gathered be carried on and useful for the future family that will know me as an ancestor?

I wish to thank Francie Lloyd and Jean Hunt for volunteering to be Nominating Committee members this year, and to thank my wife, Patty for added suggestions for approaching good people to serve as Board members and committee members for the coming year. We have, I believe, a strong group of people willing to keep SRVGS running strongly, who will be presented to the Board in April, then to the general membership at the April meeting. A new Board will then be voted in the May meeting. Anyone not yet approached who wishes to join the Board or a committee in the coming year, please call or email me.
